#### THOUGHTS FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

As the seasons change we recognize changes in nature, in light and darkness and in our own lives. We grow older, and hopefully wiser and holier. At this time of year we think of the passing of life. We celebrate All Saints Day and we pray for our departed loved ones on All Souls Day.

The faithful departed benefit from our prayers. The Mass, above all, is the uniting of our loved ones with the sacrifice of Jesus' own life made on our behalf. When we bring a Mass card to a family we are offering our prayers for the deceased with a special remembrance at the Eucharist.

This is more than a gesture of comfort. This offering of Mass for our faithful departed unites the deceased with the power of Jesus to bring us to salvation. The <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church says:</u> "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

The purification after death is called "purgatory." It recalls the soul's attachment to sin that can remain even after a sin is forgiven. We pray for the holy souls in purgatory so that united with them in Christ their journey toward full communion with God is hastened. Good works in addition to prayer join us to our loved ones on this journey as well. The power of prayer heightens our union with our loved ones after death.

The doctrine of purgatory is puzzling and perplexing to some. At heart it is a testimony to the meaning of human life created by God and redeemed thru His Son, and also to the dignity and stature of the human soul. Our lives are not coincidences of the "here & now" experiences to circumstances we encounter. Rather our lives are a call to keep our eyes fixed on the daily challenges to make our way to the blessedness of heaven. How we live, what we decide, whom we love, how we spend our time, what we seek to accumulate, all speak to how we care for our souls in the overall stewardship of our lives and vocations.

It would be comforting to think that the automatic promotion to our place in heaven is guaranteed. But that would at the very least lessen the meaning of the love Jesus has for us, and deny the significance of His suffering and death on our behalf. We pray in the "Hail Mary" for the grace of a happy death. We hope that the Sacrament of anointing will be part of our journey in serious illness. We pray for the holy souls that the deepest aspirations of their souls bring them to the blessedness of life in God's Kingdom, The heavenly Jerusalem, The wedding feast of the Lamb.

<u>Gaudium et Spes.</u> Vatican II's Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, offers this beautiful reflection: By His Incarnation, the Son of God has united Himself in a certain way, with each human being. The Son of God worked with human hands. He thought with a human mind. He acted with a human will. He loved with a human heart. Christ, the Son of God, became a full human being.

He was born of the Virgin Mary. He has truly been made one of us. He really was a man, like us in all things except sin. Innocent, like a victim lamb, Christ won life for us by freely shedding His own blood for us. In Christ, God makes all mankind His friends, and friends among ourselves. Christ set us free from slavery to the devil and to sin. Therefore, every human being can say with the Apostle St. Paul: "The Son of God loved me and gave His life for me." By suffering for us, Christ gave us an example, so that we would follow in His footsteps. Christ has also opened up a Way for us And if we follow His lead, then life and death become holy. Indeed, life and death will have a new and wonderful meaning for us.


