
Join with other men of the parish on Saturday, July 6, 7-9am in the Elizabeth Room to informally share our Catholic Christian Faith.

Several Sources at St. Elizabeth This Weekend**

Several Sources Shelters started in 1981 when Founder Kathy DiFiore took an abandoned, frightened pregnant teen into her Ramsey, NJ home. With help and mentoring from Mother Teresa beginning in 1984 and after being honored by President Ronald Reagan at the White House in 1998, Kathy's work for God's innocent preborn and their mothers expanded and now Several Sources Shelters consists of five shelters, a 24 hour pregnancy hotline and a Sonogram Center in Englewood, NJ to help pregnant women choose life for their preborn babies. The focus of the Several Sources Shelters is to save the preborn while teaching their mother's about God, His Word, especially about Holy Chastity. Their goal is that when a mother leaves the Several Sources Shelters, she has her baby in her arms and the love of Jesus in her heart. Kathy will be speaking to us about her work the weekend of June 29th. After the 12:00 mass all are welcome to meet with her and some of the girls from the shelter in the Elizabeth Room. A light lunch will be provided.

**ARCHBISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL




One sure sign that it is summer is the arrival of

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a year-long ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass and Easter Season. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non-Christians), Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic or is a Catholic but has yet to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include:

- Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church
· Baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church.
· Adult baptized Catholics who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so.
