#### THOUGHTS FROM FR. PAUL



Friends,

What is Advent all about? I think most people see it purely as a season of preparation for Christmas, which is part of it, but not the whole thing. The first two

weeks of Advent are actually "reserved" for us to focus on Christ's Second coming. We don't think of this often. Yes, in a certain way our society, especially pop- culture, is obsessed with apocalyptic and end of the world themes as seen in so many of our movies, TV. shows, and video games, but how many of us actually think of the end of the world happening because Christ will come again? Is this not what Jesus spoke about in last week's gospel? (Lk 21:25-28, 34-36) Scary isn't it? Well that's not my point in writing this. After all, Jesus doesn't want us to live in a constant state of fear and panic. He is the Prince of Peace for crying out loud! But He does want us to be ready. He doesn't want "that day catch you by surprise like a trap" (Lk 21:34). That is why the season of Advent, and our lives in general, should not be merely a matter of waiting, but of actively being ready. This implies that we must strive to live a certain way of life.

In the movie I Am Legend, Will Smith's character Dr. Robert Neville faced death every day. It wasn't comfortable, it wasn't easy, but He had to live each day a certain way; being "vigilant at all times", and living by a set of principles and rules which would allow him to not only save his own life, but possibly many others.

We face a different but very similar situation today. It is not easy to be a faithful Catholic. In fact to be one is to live almost completely counter-culturally because the culture we live in is, as Christopher West puts it, a counterfeit culture, a culture which presents the real thing as the counterfeit and the counterfeit as the real thing. We can see this most clearly in the way most media presents human sexuality. They'd have us think that anything goes and it doesn't matter what you do or who you do it with. They say that this is freedom and happiness. Can anything actually be further from the truth? How many people, young and old, feel hurt, abused, and used? How many use drugs, cut themselves, or commit suicide because they cannot deal with the pain that this life of "freedom" gives them? I lost my own former best friend this past June because he was caught up in this counterfeit culture, this "culture of death" as Blessed John Paul II defined it.

The truest answers of life are not found on *Oprah*, the *Jersey Shore*, *Family Guy*, *the Tonight Show*, David Letterman, and most certainly not on *The View*! God's view, the way for us to live our lives, is found in the Bible and the teachings of the Catholic Church. This Year of Faith which we are celebrating is meant to be a time for us to re-learn these teachings. Most people know *what* the Church teaches but don't know *why*. It is *our* responsibility to live in the truth of God's love by educating ourselves with these teachings. Thank God for gifts of the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the Theology of the Body!

St. Paul says, "You know what instructions we gave you through the Lord Jesus" and "we earnestly ask and exhort you...that, as you received from us how you should conduct yourselves to please God...you do so even more." (Thes. 4:2).

Is there a coincidence that this reading was proclaimed in every Catholic Church around the world on the first Sunday of Advent or is God trying to tell us something? Let us use this season to all be more like Dr. Robert Neville and "be vigilant at all times and pray" that we are ready when Christ comes again. "Be Not Afraid"! (J.P. II)
