What is at Stake?

Can mis-diagnosis lead to death of a non-terminally ill person? Doctors make mistakes. Hospitals make mistakes. We all make mistakes. The fact is, terminal illnesses aren't always terminal. Death sentences don't always come true. Imagine being in a position to choose life or death and, for whatever reason, making the wrong choice. There's no going back. A wrong diagnosis can deny a patient years of life spent with his or her loved ones if that patient obtains and uses a prescription for death. The law shouldn't enable this. **Oppose the NJ Death with Dignity Act (A3328/S2249).**

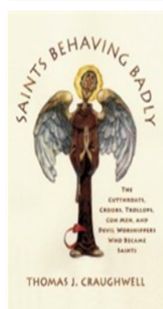

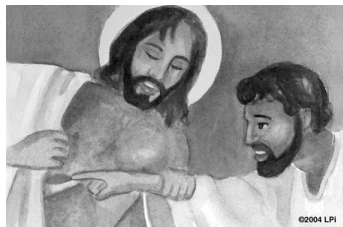

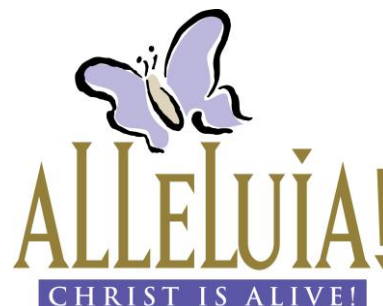
