Dear Parishioners:

We welcome Carl Bolleia as Director of Sacred Music. He brings a broad background of learning and experience to his ministry here.

Mr. Bolleia is a Doctor of Musical Arts candidate in Piano Performance at The Mason Gross School of Arts of Rutgers University, where he studies with Min Kwon. He holds a Masters of Music in Piano Performance from the City University of New York Brooklyn College Conservatory of Music, where he studied with four time Grammy Award Nominee Ursula Oppens. At CUNY, Brooklyn, he was the recipient of the Robert Starer Award for the performance of a work by a living composer. He received his Bachelors of Music in Music Education and Piano Performance with highest honors from the William Paterson University of New Jersey, where he was recognized with the Dean's Award for Outstanding Musician, the Musician Scholar Award, and graduated from the Honor's College Music Track.

Conducting credits include Assistant Conductor for The Colonial Symphony Orchestra of New Jersey, ConTempo, Brooklyn, and the William Paterson University Concert Choir. As a scholar, he is currently focused on the music of Charles Wuorinen, Franz Liszt, Oliver Messiaen and liturgy. A certified music teacher for the State of New Jersey K-12, he remains committed to music education, having assisted music programs in over 12 school districts. In 2013, he was selected to be the accompanist for NJSMA Region 1 Choir. He has served as Director of Music Admissions at the William Paterson University of New Jersey and Coadjunctant Professor at Rutgers University.

Dedicated to liturgical music, Mr. Bolleia has provided music for worship in as varied places as monasteries in rural Illinois to churches and cathedrals in Barbados and Florence. Before coming to St. Elizabeth's he served as Director of Sacred Music at Our Lady of Fatima Parish in North Bergen, NJ, where he oversaw an adult choir that tripled in size, a children's choir that started from scratch, a professional cantor rotation system, and directed a professional concert series. At St. Joseph's in Oradell, NJ, he instituted a professional cantor rotation system and saw the adult choir and children's choir double in size. His tenure at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Twp. of Washington was marked by the creation of a contemporary youth choir, creating a cantor rotation system of professionals and amateurs and increased membership in the adult choir. He has pursued additional studies in philosophy and theology at Seton Hall University, organ at The Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark, NJ and sacred music at the Institute of Sacred Music at Yale University.

Active as a performer, Mr. Bolleia has concertized throughout the metropolitan area with a vast repertoire ranging from the Renaissance to the Avant-Garde. Committed to chamber music, Mr. Bolleia has performed as a collaborative pianist with musicians of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, The New York Philharmonic, The New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, and the New Jersey Percussion Ensemble. His performance activity for the 2013-14 season began with a series of solo and chamber performances in Luxembourg.



Dear Parishioners of St. Elizabeth's:

Many of you knew Deacon Bill Toth when he was a parishioner here before his untimely death in 2008. Bill, his wife Kathleen and their children lived in this parish from 1975. Bill had many admirers in Wyckoff as he brought his love for the faith and for learning to his homilies he gave in this parish. I myself had the privilege of teaching with Bill at our Seminary and I can testify that he was always a man of integrity, wisdom and grace. Bill was also admired beyond the seminary for his commitment to spirituality in the home and the workplace – as the following note from a colleague testifies:

I can think of few professional colleagues in my long life whose presence and personal warmth are more lovingly remembered. Bill always brought forward my best efforts as I knew any endeavor he committed to was worthy and embedded in both courage and love. His beautiful companionship made undertaking any difficult challenge a joy filled remembrance. I write this note with a smile, the immediate response that always occurred when I heard his voice on the phone, was privileged to be with him in person, or now simply hear his name. Bill was a Saint who walked with us and filled our path with light. (**Andre L. Delbecq**, University Professor, Leavey School of Business, Santa Clara University).

Recently a few of Bill's friends from Seton Hall University have banded together to create an Endowed Professorship in Bill's honor at Seton Hall University. This is one of the highest honors in the life of the university. The objective is to bring outstanding contemporary thinkers to Seton Hall to link Catholicism with business, economics, diplomacy, health care and other disciplines. This was certainly Bill's aim: to infuse all these areas with vision and hope.

The group is interested in having parishioners from St. Elizabeth's join with them in their endeavor to develop the Toth Endowed Professorship and to participate in the various programs already established through Bill's leadership.

On Wednesday evening, October 23rd at 7:30pm, there will be an "Interest Meeting" at the home of Regina Toth Wackerman in Ridgewood with Msgr. Dick Liddy, Director of the Center for Catholic Studies at Seton Hall and Bob Caruso to explore ways to be involved in this honor to Bill Toth. 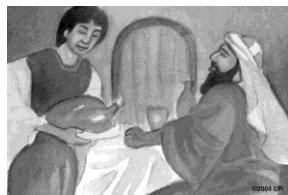

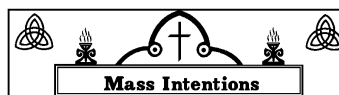
