Serving in Jesus and Mary!

I am Carlos Briceño, 31 years old, priest of the Archdiocese of Newark. I completed my formation at Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall. My native country is Colombia. I came to the United States in the fall of 2007 and I took English studies in the PALS program of Rutgers University. Throughout this period, I was engaged in vocational discernment at Emmaus House while I was assigned to St. Margaret's in Little Ferry as my home parish for apostolic experience.



My mother is Rosalbina and my father is Jose Damian. I have three older siblings; I am proudly the youngest in my family.

My sister Claudia is a biology professor, my brother Fernando is a house constructor and my brother Jose Daniel is a policeman. I have two beautiful nieces in Bogotá: Michelle and Valery.



They are the treasure of my brother Jose Daniel and of the entire family. Being out of my home country, I try to remain close to his entire family, by keeping in touch with regular phone calls, and when possible, visiting them.

I was fortunate in receiving the guidance of my pastor throughout secondary school. During these years I became involved in the life of the parish as Altar Server, Catechist and Sacristan. After high school, I enrolled in the college seminary of the Archdiocese of Bucaramanga, (Colombia) where I studied philosophy for three years.

When I was 13 years old, I began to feel the call to the priesthood. I was struck by Jesus' invitation to give my life for others, so I believe the way I can give my life is through the priesthood. As Jesus gave his life, I feel the call to consecrate and to give my life to God for His people in the Catholic Church.

In 2004 I transferred to the University in Bogotá where I continued philosophical studies and priestly formation. While at the university I had the opportunity to work in campus ministry, receiving the guidance and advice of my Spiritual Director as I continued my preparation for the priesthood. During this time, I felt the call to be a missionary, to get involved with other cultures and languages, so I was invited by a seminarian friend to go to the United States to continue studying for the priesthood in the Archdiocese of Newark. It was difficult for me to leave my family and country, but I have always believed what St. Matthew says: "And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or fields for my sake will receive a hundred times as much and will inherit eternal life." (Matt. 19:29)

Then, I made contact with the Archdiocesan Vocations Office, and came to this country immediately after receiving the licentiate in philosophy. I was ordained a Deacon on May 22nd in the Cathedral Basilica of The Sacred Heart of Newark. I was assigned to the Church of the Nativity at Midland Park, by Archbishop John Joseph Myers for 2011-2012. With God's help I was ordained a priest on May 26, 2012. I served as Parochial Vicar at St. John's in Hillsdale for two years. I am very happy for my welcome by Fr. Jim and the beautiful people of St. Elizabeth's Church and also very excited to be a parochial vicar. I look forward to ministering to you and hope to receive all the help I can get to be a faithful priest.



Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a year-long ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass and Easter Season. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non-Christians), Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic or is a Catholic but has yet to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include:

- · Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church
- · Baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church.
- · Adult baptized Catholics who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so.


