ROSES TO BREAD WEEKEND
HONORING THE
FEAST OF ST. ELIZABETH
NOVEMBER 15 & 16

In honor of the feast of our parish patroness, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, we will have a **Roses to Breads** initiative during the weekend of November 15-16th. This event will bring honor to the memory of this great saint. Tradition tells us about Saint Elizabeth's heart for the needy. She was at one time forbidden to bring more food from the palace kitchen to the starving poor, but she did it anyway. When she was caught and was made to open her coat; she was hiding bread underneath it for the poor. A miracle took place and, instead of bread, roses fell out. This miraculous event occurred during the cold winter months when no roses were blooming. As the story goes, she was never disturbed again in her charitable giving. In keeping with that tradition, our BOLD youth ministry will host the Roses to Breads initiative, selling roses after all Masses on St. Elizabeth's feast day weekend. All proceeds will support Oasis and the Bridges Outreach to the Homeless. The teens will use the money directly to shop for and prepare food in the greatest areas of need of the organizations above.

Please support us in our effort to teach our young Catholics the value of charity and loving the poor as one of the essential marks of our Roman Catholic faith.

Just a recap from last year... countless miracles have been attributed to Our Lady of Guadalupe as She continues her loving intercession for God's people. In 1991, Dan Lynch, a successful judge, founded an apostolate to spread the word of Our Lady's love and care, especially for the pre-born. He was inspired by St. John Paul II's fervent prayer for Our Lady of Guadalupe to visit the Americas again to bring about peace and love for Jesus and one another in our lives, families, and culture. The Missionary Images were created as exact replicas of the original preserved tilma of Juan Diego in Mexico to travel the world to bring the same message of healing, hope and respect for life that our Mother brought to the Aztecs in 1531. Many conversions, healings, reconciliations, and miracles occur with the Missionary Images which travel to churches, prisons, hospitals, homes, and abortion clinics.

The Missionary Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe brings the Blessed Mother to us in a unique, tangible way. Many people can actually hear her heartbeat up close to the Image! Her tender presence can be felt when visitors venerate and pray with her. She is able to take any situation we are facing to Her Son and intercede for us if we just ask. 
