“Jesus I Trust in You”

A Reflection on World Youth Day 2016

The days preceding my departure for Poland were full of last minute packing, many prayers, and nervousness. Many fears and doubts filled my mind as I prepared to leave. My recurring fear was of the turmoil that was occurring in Europe. I was fearful of getting hurt while in Poland and of any acts of violence that might occur during the World Youth Day events. Without being fully aware of it, the image of Divine Mercy began to enter my mind at this time. “Jesus I Trust in You” would become my mantra as I left for the airport and during my time in Poland.

We arrived in Poland on the morning of July 23rd, and spent the first day exploring the city of Warsaw and getting used to the fact that we would spend our pilgrimage doing a lot of walking. Our first night was spent in Warsaw and when we woke in the morning, we departed for Czestochowa. It was there that we encountered the Shrine of the Black Madonna. I felt anxious and nervous to encounter an image so honored and loved across the world. Waiting in line to see the image did not help to calm my nerves. However, when my group had finally reached the small room in which the image is held, I was awestruck. To be before an image that Poland itself deemed queen and protectress was overwhelming. We then had mass in front of the image. That evening we proceeded to Krakow for World Youth Day.

Day 3 was spent visiting Auschwitz, Birkenau, Wadowice, and the Divine Mercy Sanctuary in Krakow was one in which everyone’s emotions varied. I personally experienced solemnness at Auschwitz and Birkenau, joy in St. John Paul II’s hometown of Wadowice, and reprieve during mass in the Divine Mercy Sanctuary in Krakow. Day 4 included touring Krakow and attending the Opening Ceremony and Mass in Bolonia Park. The most memorable moments during this day included meeting Catholics from all over the world and watching the waving of flags during the ceremony. Never before had I experienced such a feeling of unity with the youth of our Church.

Day 5 was spent participating in Catechesis in an arena followed by evening adoration led by Matt Maher and Audrey Aussad. Most memorable of this day was watching Pope Francis land in Poland through a live stream. The entire arena gave a roar at his landing. On Thursday, (Day 6), we attended the Welcome Ceremony for Pope Francis. The event was full of dancing and cheering as youth from all over the world welcomed and thanked Pope Francis for coming to Poland. It was also in this crowd of nearly two million people that I ran into my old campus minister. Running into her was further proof for me that I was meant to be in Poland. Day 7 was spent attending Catechesis with Cardinal Dolan and reading the Stations of the Cross together as a group, reflecting on Jesus’ Passion.

Day 8 was one that was most physically and emotionally taxing. It was on this day that we walked 6 miles to Camp Misericordiae as a group. This is the camp at which we participated in the evening vigil with Pope Francis. “Camp Misericordiae” translates to “Field of Mercy”. It was mercy that truly worked through my heart and that of those around me on this day. Prior to the vigil, I spent my time introducing myself to nearby pilgrims and trading items with them.

Despite how exhausted and hungry most of my group was, I felt an overwhelming sense of peace and happiness on this day. I spent the evening praying and bonding with members of my group. In the morning, we had mass with Pope Francis and then returned back to our hotel. This marked the end of scheduled World Youth Day events for my group.

Upon my return home, I spent much time reflecting on my vocation and what God’s mercy means for me and my life. World Youth Day did not only teach me to be merciful to others, but to myself. Mercy is not just about forgiving your enemies or giving to the less fortunate. I realize now that mercy is also about forgiving yourself for times when you fail. I often strive for perfection in all aspects of my life. Acknowledging the mercy presented to me in Poland meant acknowledging the fact that I come with many flaws, and that is okay. I have acknowledged that Jesus does not love us despite our flaws; He loves us because of them. For it is in our moments of weakness that we turn to Him for His love and mercy. The image of Divine Mercy has the famous quote “Jesus I Trust in You” on the bottom. What World Youth Day taught me is that Jesus trusts in us also. He trusts that we will turn to Him for love and forgiveness, and He trusts that we will always know that He awaits us with open arms.

Lastly, I would like to give thanks for all who supported my trip to Poland, Fr. Jim and all others. My life has been changed for the better because of my experience. As I prepare for college, I think of my experience in Poland daily. I reflect and journal often so as to keep a firm reminder of my encounter with God in my heart. If there was anyone who wished to attend this World Youth Day and missed out, I urge you to plan for World Youth Day 2019 in Panama! I will be in school at the time but I have every intention of going, possibly once again with our own Parish. I ask that you all continue to keep the youth of the Church, those who are impoverished, and those who are returning to school in your prayers. You all are always in mine.
