In addition to these, the *Magnificat* has spiritual reflections and beautiful reproductions of religious art along with a commentary on it. 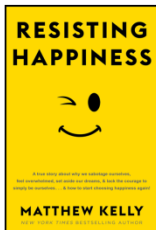
